


Baltimore City has made improving the safety of its residents and visitors a priority. From 2000 to 2009, the Part 1 crime rate and violent crime rate have both declined. The number of reported Part 1 crime incidents has decreased by over 42% and violent crime incidents has decreased by over 41% from 2000 to 2009. Over the same time period, juvenile arrests have also declined by nearly 33%. BNIA-JFI currently analyzes seven indicators designed to track both adult and juvenile crime and safety in Baltimore City and its neighborhoods. All of the data is provided by the Baltimore City Police Department. BNIA-JFI normalizes this data by population – total population for adult crime and domestic violence and persons aged 10 to 17 for juvenile crime. Normalizing the data by population allows for the rate to reflect the concentration of the crime relative to the population in the area and allows for comparison between areas of different populations. A summary of these crime and safety indicators and their change over the past several years is described below.

Adult Crime

BNIA-JFI tracks two measures of adult crime. These include Part 1 crimes (offenses that include murder, aggravated assault, attempted rape, burglary, larceny, and auto theft) and violent crime (offenses that include homicide, aggravated assault, rape, and robbery). These indicators reflect the general safety in neighborhoods and the City and includes both personal and property crimes.



- Both the Part 1 crime rate and the violent crime rate in Baltimore City have declined. This indicates a greater level of safety and less violence overall in Baltimore City as compared to previous years.
- The Part 1 crime rate in Baltimore City has declined from 106.0 offenses per 1,000 persons in 2000 to 59.6 offenses per 1,000 persons in 2009. The CSAs that have experienced the greatest decreases in Part 1 crime have been Downtown/Seton Hill, Midtown, and Perkins/Middle East.
- The CSAs with the highest overall crime rates in 2009 were Downtown/Seton Hill (423.8 offenses per 1,000 persons) and Washington Village/Pigtown (120.9 offenses per 1,000 persons). A reason why these areas have high crime rates is that these areas have a large number of employees and tourists and that the number of crimes is normalized by the resident population which is relatively low compared to the total number of employees and tourists.

- The violent crime rate for Baltimore City from 2000 to 2009 has decreased. The City's violent crime rate fell from 26.2 violent offenses per 1,000 persons in 2000 to 15.3 violent offenses per 1,000 persons in 2009. The greatest decreases in violent crimes were in Downtown/Seton Hill, Perkins/Middle East, and Patterson Park North and East.

Domestic Violence


The domestic violence rate is used to measure the degree of reported domestic abuse in City households. The data comes from 911 calls and can come from any person reporting abuse, not necessarily the victim of the abuse.

- In 2009, the number of 911 calls reporting incidences of domestic violence was approximately 48 incidences per 1,000 persons (47.8). This is an increase of slightly more than 8 calls per 1,000 persons from 2008.
- From 2000 to 2009, the greatest decreases in calls of domestic violence were in Perkins/Middle East (-52.8) and Madison/East End (-48.6).
- From 2000 to 2009, the greatest increases in 911 calls for domestic violence from 2000 to 2009 were reported in Mount Washington/Coldspring (37.8) and Greater Roland Park/Poplar Hill (32.9).

Juvenile Crime

BNIA-JFI tracks four juvenile crime indicators. These are: juvenile arrest rate; juvenile arrests for violent offenses; juveniles arrested for drug-related offenses; and juveniles arrested who have committed a previous offense. These indicators are analyzed and presented as to where the juvenile lives and not where the juvenile is arrested or where the crime is committed.

- The juvenile arrest rate per 1,000 youths has decreased by slightly less than 42 arrests per 1,000 youths in Baltimore City from 127.5 juvenile arrests per 1,000 juveniles in 2000 to 85.7 in 2009.
- The CSAs with the greatest decreases in juvenile crime from 2000 to 2009 include Greater Govans,



Southeastern, and Medfield/Hampden/Woodberry/Remington.

- While overall juvenile crimes decreased, the rate of juvenile arrests for violent offenses has increased from 2000 (10.7 juveniles arrested per 1,000 juveniles) to 2009 (16.7 juveniles arrested per 1,000 juveniles).
- The rate of juveniles arrested for drug-related offenses has decreased from 2000 (39.3 offenses per 1,000 juveniles) to 2009 (32.1 offenses per 1,000 juveniles).
- In 2009, 65.8% of juveniles arrested had committed a previous offense.
