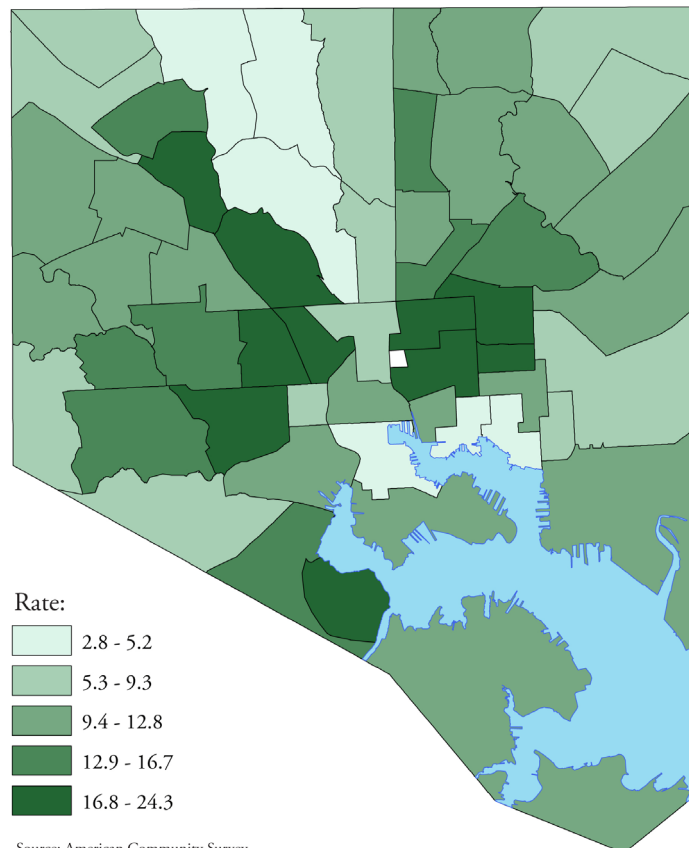


Baltimore City is the regional center for the metropolitan area in terms of both population and economic activity. The City is home to nearly 621,000 residents who are a major source of labor for businesses in the City, region and State. The City is also a major center of economic activity and is home to over 20,000 businesses and approximately 374,000 employees. However, the City is economically distressed in comparison to the State of Maryland. In 2010, State unemployment rate was 7.8% and the City's was 10.9%¹.

BNIA-JFI tracks fourteen workforce and economic development indicators that measure the importance of and role of the City as both a major source of labor and as a center of economic activity. These indicators are grouped into the following categories: labor force participation and employment; educational attainment;

commercial investment activity; and businesses and successful small businesses. Information for the City of Baltimore is now available on an annual basis from the American Community Survey (ACS), but community-level information is aggregated over 5-years of data collection. In Vital Signs 10, indicators were calculated using the 5-year average from the 2006-2010 ACS. Business data is purchased from InfoUSA and is available at the address level, which can be aggregated to the CSA level for Vital Signs. It is still important to note that the firm level data from InfoUSA is best to be analyzed at the City level since due to methodology issues, individual level firm data can be problematic to analyze. Highlights of the workforce and economic development indicators tracked by BNIA-JFI are described below.

Labor Force Participation and Employment²

BNIA-JFI collects four indicators of labor force participation and employment. These indicators include the percentage of the population that is employed, the percentage of the population that is unemployed and looking for work, the percentage of the population not in the labor force, and the unemployment rate. These indicators provide a picture as to the workforce characteristics of Baltimore City residents. This data comes from the Census and the American Community Survey. Small area population data, such as labor force and employment statistics is available from the American Community Survey using multi-year averages.

- The American Community Survey data for 2010 identifies 12.6% of the City's workforce as unemployed with six CSAs having at least one of every five persons being unemployed.
- In 2010, the CSAs with the lowest unemployment rates are Mt. Washington/Coldspring (2.8%) and Canton (3.0%) while the CSAs with the highest unemployment rates are Southwest Baltimore (24.3%) and Penn North/Reservoir Hill (24.2%).
- Currently, the American Community Survey reports that 38.4% of the City's residents are not in the labor force. There are 25 CSAs where the percentage of persons aged 16 to 64 that are not in the labor force exceeds 40%.
- Seven and a half percent of the City's residents between the ages of 16 and 64 are currently unemployed and looking for work. Mt. Washington/Coldspring has the lowest percentage of unemployed residents seeking work at 2.2% and Southwest Baltimore has the highest percentage at 14.3%.
- The percentage of persons in Baltimore City between the ages of 16 and 64 that are employed decreased from 58.6% in 2000 to 54.1% in 2010. The CSA with the greatest percentage of residents aged 16 to 64 that are employed is Canton at 76.5% and the lowest is Upton/Druid Heights at 35.6%.

Educational Attainment³

BNIA-JFI tracks two educational attainment indicators collected from the Census and American Community Survey: (1) the percentage of the population with a high school degree; and (2) the percentage with at least some college education. These measures of education attainment are important because in today's increasingly complex economy, most jobs at the very least require a high school level of education and an increasingly number of jobs require additional degrees or certifications, such as a bachelors degree or above. Baltimore's population has experienced an increase in educational attainment and since 2000, with the percentage of residents with a high school degree remaining steady and those with at least some college education increasing. This increase may be due to a combination of an increasing number of residents graduating from school and also from the new residents moving to either live or work in Baltimore City that have a higher level of educational attainment.

- From 2000 to 2010, the percentage of persons (aged 25 and above) that have a high school diploma held steady at 29.4%.
- The percentage of City residents with at least some college education (aged 25 and above) increased from 45.1% in 2000 to 47.9% in 2010.
- In 2010 there are twenty three CSAs where at least 50% of the residents over the age of 25 have some college education and two CSAs (Mt. Washington/Coldspring and Greater Roland Park/Poplar Hill) where over 90% of the residents over the age of 25 have some college education.

Commercial Investment Activity

BNIA-JFI tracks two indicators of commercial investment activity: the total number of commercial properties and the percentage of commercial properties that apply for and receive a rehabilitation permit (a measure of business investment in real estate). The number of commercial properties in Baltimore City has decreased and since 20007, fewer businesses are applying for and receiving rehabilitation permits. Data for commercial businesses comes from the Baltimore City Department of Housing and Community Development.

- The number of commercial properties in Baltimore City has continued to decline from 16,480 in 2009 to 15,828 in 2010. This is a decline of 4% from the previous year.
- The percentage of commercial properties that applied for and received a rehabilitation permit of greater than \$5,000 decreased slightly from 12.9% in 2009 to 12.4% in 2010.
- Since 2001, the percentage of commercial properties in Baltimore City applying for and receiving a rehabilitation permit has increased by 8.8%.

Businesses and Successful Small Businesses

BNIA-JFI tracks six indicators of business activity and of successful small businesses. These indicators include: the total number of businesses, total employment; the number of businesses with fewer than 50 employees; the number of businesses with between 50 to 100 employees; the percent of businesses over four years old; and the percent of businesses with 50 or fewer employees that are more than four years old. BNIA-JFI uses data from InfoUSA, a national marketing firm. The data for each business is collected through a combination of methods including phone directories, product registrations, United States Postal Service files, and surveys. As a result of how the data is collected, there can be significant variation from year to year in the number of businesses and employment. Additionally, firms with multiple branches or establishments may report their total employment out of a single location which may distort an accurate count of employees. For these reasons, long-term comparisons of the data between years are not recommended.

- Of the approximately 20,000 businesses in Baltimore City in 2010, 14.8% are located in the Downtown/Seton Hill CSA and 5.4% are located in the Midtown CSA.
- In 2010, there were approximately 374,000 persons employed by businesses in Baltimore City. These persons include both City residents and persons who live outside of Baltimore City.
- A vast majority of businesses in Baltimore have fewer than 100 employees. In 2010, 95% of firms employ less than 50 persons, and 3% employ 50 to 99 persons.

- In 2010, 56.6% of businesses in Baltimore City can be considered to be small and successful businesses. These firms have 50 or fewer employees and are more than four years old. The CSAs with the greatest percentage of small and successful businesses is Cherry Hill (73.9%) followed by Harford/Echodale (68.3%).
